French Navy H160 Project

In partnership with Airbus Helicopters and Safran Helicopter Engines, Babcock ensures the development of additional type certificates for an H160 configuration adapted to the needs of the French Navy. Babcock also provides maintenance and support to the fleet.

Babcock France is a recognised helicopter MRO partner to the French authorities and armed forces. Babcock has been selected by the General Directorate of Armament (DGA notification on January 31, 2020) to deliver the French Navy interim fleet project once the future H160M helicopter - the Guépard - has been delivered (a fleet of 169 are expected to be replaced).

In association with Airbus Helicopters and Safran Helicopter Engines, Babcock will supply the French Navy with a fleet of six modified H160 helicopters. The 13 modifications will be implemented by Babcock France from its site in Le Cannet-des-Maures, where the extensive infrastructure will accommodate the base maintenance of this latest generation fleet.

Line maintenance for this fleet will also be carried out by Babcock on these three bases.
